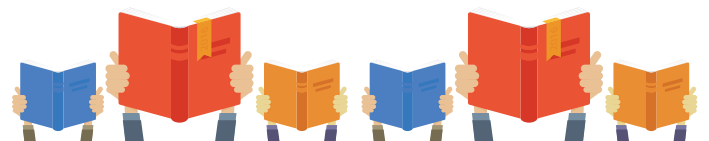

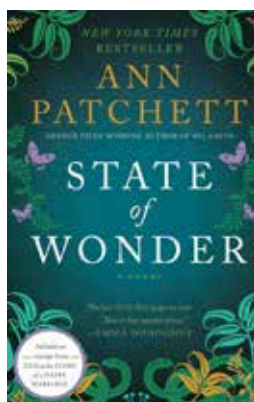
Florence Foster Jenkins (2016)

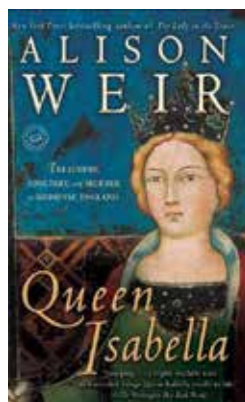

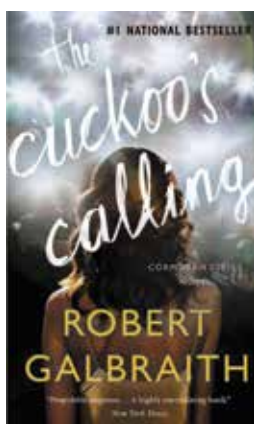
SHELTER ISLAND LIBRARY BOOK CLUB:

Acclaimed author Alison Weir reexamines the life of England's Queen Isabella - one of history's most notorious and charismatic queens. Or read a book of your choice!

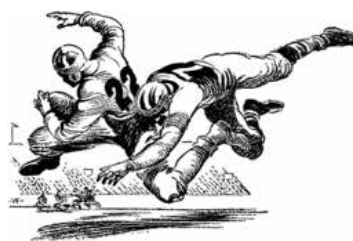


MYSTERY MONDAY BOOK CLUB:

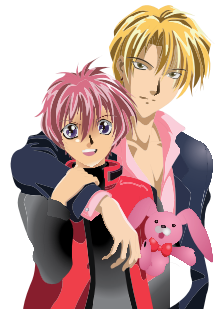
