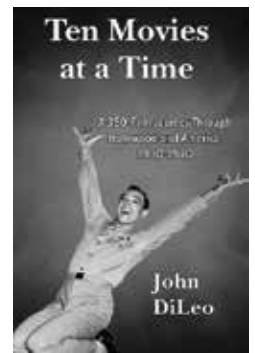

FRIDAY NIGHT DIALOGUES

Mollie Numark and journalist Gary Paul Gates will discuss Mollie's full and memorable life - from living through the strife and turmoil of World War II England to studying ballet, to dancing in the post war years in London's West End, to coming to New York's Latin Quarter and running her own ballet school.

DEFIANT REQUIEM

Defiant Requiem is a feature-length documentary film that tells the extraordinary, untold story of the brave acts of artistic resistance by Jewish prisoners at Theresienstadt (Terezin) during World War II. This is a film about how a rare form of courage sparked compelling determination to survive by answering the worst of mankind with the best of mankind.

Marion Ein Lewin, a board member of The Defiant Requiem Foundation, is herself a Holocaust survivor. She will speak and answer questions after the film. The screening is taking place in recognition of Holocaust Remembrance Day April 12.

The Snow Child by Eowyn Ivey

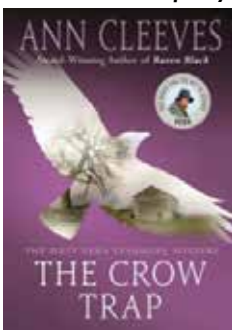

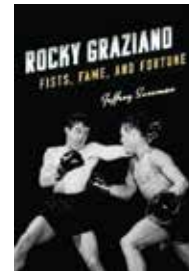
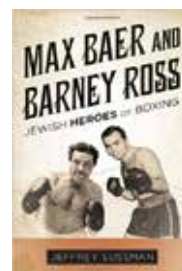


AUTHOR TALK: JEFFREY SUSSMAN ON BOXING GREATS

Author Jeffrey Sussman has written two books about boxing champions. In *Max Baer and Barney Ross: Jewish Heroes of Boxing*, Sussman vividly chronicles the careers and lives of two fighters who inspired Jewish fans in a time of widespread Anti-Semitism.

His latest book, *Rocky Graziano: Fists, Fame and Fortune*, the first biography of Graziano in over 60 years, tells the dramatic rags-to-riches story of a man raised by an abusive father who became middleweight champion of the world. Mr. Sussman will read from both books as well as answer questions. This talk should fascinate not only boxing fans but also anyone interested in history or inspiring life stories.

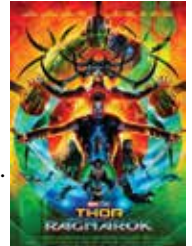

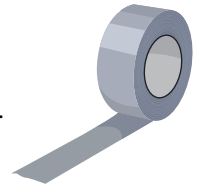
