Thursday, October 25th, 5:30pm



The first novel to feature war-damaged Scotland Yard inspector Ian Rutledge, A Test of Wills is the book that brought author Charles Todd into the spotlight. This Edgar® and Anthony Award-nominated, New York Times Notable mystery brilliantly evokes post-World War I Great Britain and introduces readers to one of crime fiction's most compelling series protagonists. Here the shell-shocked Rutledge struggles to retain his fragile grip on sanity while investigating the death of a popular army colonel.

Northanger Abbey

Austen's satire of gothic novels was the first to be completed for publication, but wasn't published until after her death in 1817. It is the coming of age story of tomboy and "heroine in training" Catherine Morland, lover of gothic novels. Northanger Abbey treats its characters as flawed, well-rounded individuals, not as perfect heroes, heroines and villains (as was the prevailing style of the era).

SOUTH AFRICA'S FRAGILE DEMOCRACY

But the party today suffers from popular frustration over official corruption and economic stagnation. Given America's history of opportunistic engagements with Africa, there are few prospects for a closer relationship between the two countries. Meanwhile, a weaker ANC could lead to political fragmentation in this relatively new democracy.
