


CLASSICS BOOK CLUB:

There, to her offspring's utter amazement, she revels in her new freedom, recalls her youthful ambitions, and gathers some very unsuitable companions - who reveal to her just how much she had sacrificed under the pressure of others' expectations.




MYSTERY MONDAY BOOK CLUB:
