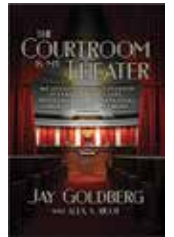


# ADULT PROGRAMS

**Friday, November 8th, 7:00pm: *The Courtroom is My Theatre* with Attorney Jay Goldberg**

Johnny Cash, Donald Trump, Willie Nelson, John F. Kennedy, The Rolling Stones and the "Men of Honor" who founded modern Las Vegas. What do these famous figures have in common? All have been represented by Jay Goldberg, one of the most lauded trial attorneys of our time. In his memoir, *The Courtroom Is My Theater*, Mr. Goldberg shares stories of high profile courtroom drama and his dealings with some of the world's most powerful and colorful characters. **Friday, November 15th, 7:00pm: *Musician and Composer Arthur Chitz - A talk by Paulann Sheets***

Composer, pianist, and conductor Arthur Chitz was Music Director at the Dresdner Schauspielhaus. His career was tragically cut short when he was unable to escape Germany during the war and he became a victim of the Holocaust. Chitz's work, which includes a Sinfonietta, string quartets, vocal works, and chamber music, was all but lost until musicologist Agata Schindler worked with his family to bring his music back into the public sphere. Chitz's daughter in law, Shelter Islander Paulann Sheets, will speak about his music and her recent trip to Dresden with Arthur Chitz's descendants to install a portrait by Susan Sheets, artist and wife of Chitz's oldest grandson. **Registration is appreciated.**

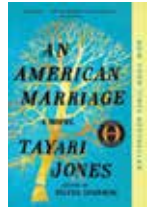

**Tuesday, November 19th, 5:30pm: *Thanksgiving Fare***

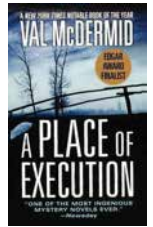

**Tuesday, November 5th, 5:00pm**

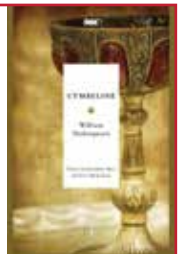

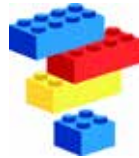
Join us for a fun and relaxed storytime featuring old favorites and new selections from our collection.

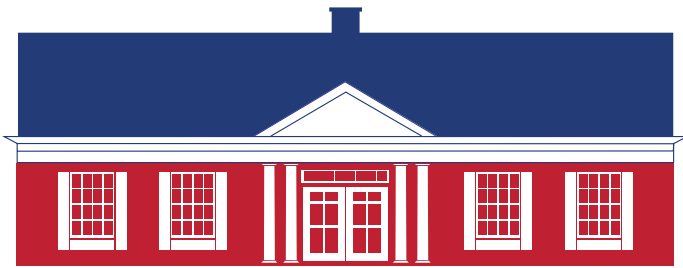

During World War I, the U.S. Army Signal Corps desperately needed telephone operators who could connect calls and translate conversations between French and American troops. The 223 women who volunteered wore Army uniforms, swore an oath, held rank and were subject to military justice. Though they were recognized for their service, they were told by the Government upon their return that they were never soldiers.
