LIBRARY HISTORY



Shelter Island's first library was created in 1885 through the efforts of Professor Eben Norton Horsford. a Harvard professor and friend of many literary lights of his day. Professor Horsford was owner of Sylvester Manor through marriage to a descendant of the Island's founding family. He donated 280 volumes for the first library, which was initially housed in a closet in the Old Store. The building was located not far from the present library. It

functioned as a post office, telegraph station, and local meeting place. The store burned down in 1891. A new library containing more books donated by Professor Horsford was built on a nearby lot donated by his daughter Lilian. His daughter Cornelia became the library's first president.




DIY MIRROR ART: Saturday, February 18th, 2:30pm



Saturday, February 25th, 2:00pm 🔾


